## Primary Sport Premium Funding at The Bishops' CofE & RC Primary School

## **2023 - 2024**

Since September 2013 through a Sport Premium, the Government has provided funding to schools to support the provision for and delivery of PE and sport in primary schools.

Funding has been allocated through a lump sum for each school and a per-pupil top-up mechanism. Each school receives £16,000 (via two payments) and an additional £10 per head for all children (except children in EYFS).

At The Bishops' CofE & RC Primary School we are committed to ensuring our children understand the importance of being active, having a healthy lifestyle and enjoy sport and games activities.

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
