



ARCHERY COMP





Mrs Parker had set Cedar class the huge reading target of reaching 891 comments in their reading records by half term.


Well they have reached that with two weeks to spare and on the last count had amassed 971 comments!

Applications can be made online via www.essex.gov.uk/admissions - parents of Year 6 children need to log onto the website and make an application by the statutory national closing date of 31st October 2024.

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
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Tadgh and Bobby both received their next level belts at martial arts. Tadgh received his yellow belt. Bobby received his yellow orange
