7 of the 8 medals available and every child who competed helped to make us the **highest scoring** school on the day. Well done everyone!










There has been something strange in school this week - multiple stories coming from Year 2 about an adventurous meerkat that has been making mischief around school.

Northern Lights in Year 1








They have also been studying the make-up of the Bible, and Philip (below) has drawn this excellent picture of the baptism of Jesus.




