Football Regional Finals!

Last Thursday, the Year 6 Boys' Football Team travelled to Tonbridge in Kent to represent Chelmsford City FC at the South East Regional Finals encompassing schools



from Essex, North & East London and Kent. The team navigated their group stage impressively winning five of their matches, finishing top on goal difference, and only losing a tight 2 - 1 match against Maidstone. Southend awaited them in the semi-finals, which the boys won comprehensively 2 - 0, repeating their score from the group stage.

Now the final and Maidstone stood between them and a place at the South National Finals. Sadly, it wasn't to

be on the day, and Maidstone, an impressive team and arguably the best our school has ever played, deservedly ran out 3 - 0 winners after a glorious long strike and catching two more on the break as we chased the game.

For the boys, however, their place at the South National Finals, in Slough on the

1st April, was secured as they were statistically the best team across the four regional finals.

An incredible achievement and the furthest any Bishops' sporting team has achieved in our school's history!


Completing Permission Slips
