Another highlight was our visit to the art galleries where we had the opportunity to enjoy and sketch some original artwork from Monet, Renoir and Picasso.

Letters will be sent out early next term.



Wale and his mum will be setting up outside the front of school at the end of the day on Friday 4th April (today!) and Friday 25th April.



It is always a joy to hear success stories of ex-Bishops' pupils.


