and choreography!




## Science Fair at New Hall

Amira and Elsie: Which cereal contains the most iron?

Edie and Nelly: Does the colour of food affect the perceived flavour?

#### **New Hall Science Fair**

On Wednesday we went to New Hall to take part in a science fair which was really fun.

We were up against lots of different schools as well as New Hall.

First of all we turned up and collected our lanyards in either black, orange, yellow or silver (which was our group) with our name, school and timetable on. Each group had a different timetable for the first ever science fair at New Hall – this one!

Next we set up our stalls which didn't take long, so we went to find some seats in the front row ready for the safety talk and an explanation of what we were doing during the time we were there.

After that, we went to our first activity which was either chemistry, biology or physics.

Ours was chemistry where we got to make mini explosions, rainbow test tubes and a periodic table. Gregory did phosphorus Isaac did Iodine.

For the next two hours each group did the rest of the activities. Our order was Virtual Reality (where we learnt about mini beasts), New Hall Farm (where we watched a ferret go through a maze to find liver), Colchester Zoo (where we stroked a real leopard skin) and the Imperial War Museum (where we made propellers).

After lunch finally made our way to our stalls ready for the judges and New Hall students to come round, ask us questions and have a go at our science experiment that we had been preparing for in the previous weeks.

Finally, there was an award ceremony and Oscar and Griffin (in year 6) got 1<sup>st</sup> prize in the student's category!


















FS children have been describing animals and getting us to guess what they are – and then revealing the picture! Great work!


