# Year 6 SATS Results

We are incredibly proud of our Year 6 pupils who have gained the best results for The Bishops' for many years.

It was very moving seeing the staff give the results to your children in individual meetings, full of praise for their efforts and explaining the value of each result.

Over 90% reached the expected level in maths, and over 85% reached this in Reading and Writing, with 80% reaching it in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling.

All of these are well over the national results for 2024 (we do not yet know the national figures for 2025). **80%** of our pupils achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined – and the national figure last year was **62%**.

The % of pupils who reached the 'exceeding' was also significantly higher than national – so many congratulations to all our Year 6s, and great thanks to you parents for your support and the staff for their amazing teaching.

For all those children who did not reach these standards, it's important to say how incredibly proud we are of their progress and all the things we hold dear at Bishops' creativity, kindness and positive character.






# Clay Creations at Art Club

The Art Club have been enjoying clay and painting this week.












#### Some other events this week:

This week, we welcomed **Sandra Hitching, our new School Crossing Patrol**, who seems to have settled so quickly to the role.


Please wait for Sandra to invite you to cross before heading into the road – she will


always go to the middle of the road and make sure the traffic is stopped before inviting you to cross. Thank you.

# Staying Safe on the Roads


It is really important for your child to wear a helmet when cycling to and from school.
